## Pastor Peter's message notes From Sunday, March 29



Why do we make decisions we know will hurt us and other people? Paul describes this inner conflict in Romans 7:19: "For I do not do the good I want, but the evil I do not want is what I do." How does Jesus help us to overcome the evil within?

1. Decide in advance how God is calling us to behave.
2. Read scripture to learn who God calls us to be.
3. Ask Jesus in prayer to help us overcome our desire to do things that we know will hurt us.

One of my focuses in seminary was Pastoral Care. I took a series of classes and practicums focused on developing an understanding of how to help people overcome challenges and walk with Christ.

A required part of this training was to attend an Alcoholics Anonymous meeting. I was struck by the level of self-awareness and spiritual maturity in the people I met there. The members of the Alcoholics Anonymous group had a deep understanding of their own tendency to choose what would hurt them. They also understood the absolute necessity of asking God for help in overcoming their addictions. Not just once, but again and again, every day. Asking God for help. We can't do it alone.

In resolution to his struggle with the evil within, Paul writes in Romans 7:24-25 how he was saved when he threw himself on the mercy of Jesus and his power to save: "Wretched man that I am! Who will rescue me from this body of death? Thanks be to God through Jesus Christ our Lord!" Romans 7:24-25

Because of the evolving COVID-19 situation, we will not be able to hold the drive-through food drive for UCM's Campus Cupboard on Palm Sunday, April 5. Instead, we are asking for a monetary donation. There are two ways to donate:


